1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Multiquip Pty Ltd (Multiquip Aggregates) engaged Ramboll Australia Pty Ltd (Ramboll) to conduct an Independent Environmental Audit (IEA) of the Ardmore Park Quarry project. The quarry is located at 5152 Oallen Ford Road, Bungonia, New South Wales (NSW). The project involves the extraction and processing of sand and hard rock material.

Ardmore Park Quarry operates under Project Approval MP07_0155 (the Approval or Project Approval). The Project Approval was issued by the then Minister for Planning in September 2009 under Part 3A (since repealed) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. Quarrying activities commenced on a campaign basis in 2013. The Project Approval has been modified three times. The most recent modification (MOD3) was granted in September 2020 which increased the total material extraction allowed from 400,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) to 580,000 tpa. Previous modifications to the Project Approval were granted in October 2010 (MOD1) and November 2013 (MOD2).

CEAL Limited trading as Multiquip Quarries is the "Proponent" for the purpose of MP07_0155. It is understood that Multiquip Pty Ltd (trading as Multiquip Aggregates) is a subsidiary of CEAL Limited. This IEA is required under Condition 6 of Schedule 5 of the Project Approval.

This Audit is the third IEA for this development. The first IEA was conducted by Trevor Brown and Associates in 2015 (herein referred to as the 2015 IEA). The second IEA was conducted by Groundwork Plus in 2018 (herein referred to as the 2018 IEA).

The objective of the Audit was to independently assess the environmental performance and compliance status of the project during the Audit Period. The Audit Period is from 21 November 2018 to 19 April 2022.

The Auditors consider management of the project to be of a generally adequate standard in relation to site management and environmental performance. The Auditors assessed the development to be compliant with MP07_0155 except for fourteen non-compliances which are summarised in the following table. No findings of non-compliance with the conditions of Environment Protection Licence (EPL) 13213 have been made. Ten recommendations have been made in relation to the non-compliances with the Project Approval, as well as nine in relation to opportunities for improvement in relation to the Project Approval and/or EPL 13213.

2. INTRODUCTION

2.1 Background

Multiquip Pty Ltd engaged Ramboll Australia Pty Ltd (Ramboll) to conduct an Independent Environmental Audit (IEA) of the Ardmore Park Quarry project. The quarry is located at 5152 Oallen Ford Road, Bungonia, New South Wales (NSW). The project involves the extraction and processing of sand and hard rock material (basalt).

Ardmore Park Quarry operates under Project Approval MP07_0155 (the Approval or Project Approval). The Project Approval was issued by the then Minister for Planning in September 2009 under Part 3A (since repealed) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. Quarrying activities commenced on a campaign basis in 2013 with the extraction of hard rock for the construction of Bungonia Bypass road as part of the project. The Project Approval has been modified three times. The most recent modification (MOD3) was granted in September 2020 which increased the total material extraction allowed from 400,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) to 580,000 tpa. Previous modifications to the Project Approval were granted in October 2010 (MOD1) and November 2013 (MOD2).

CEAL Limited trading as Multiquip Quarries is the "Proponent" for the purpose of MP07_0155. It is understood that Multiquip Pty Ltd (trading as Multiquip Aggregates) is a subsidiary of CEAL Limited.

This Audit is the third IEA for this development. The first IEA was conducted by Trevor Brown and Associates in 2015 (herein referred to as the 2015 IEA). The second IEA was conducted by Groundwork Plus in 2018 (herein referred to as the 2018 IEA).

The Project Approval conditions are divided into four parts as follows:

- Schedule 2 Administrative Conditions
- Schedule 3 Environmental Performance
- Schedule 4 Additional Procedures
- Schedule 5 Environmental Management, Monitoring, Reporting and Auditing

This IEA is required under Condition 6 of Schedule 5 of the Project Approval:

INDEPENDENT ENVIRONMENTAL AUDIT

6. Within 2 years of the date of the commencement of quarrying operations, and every 3 years thereafter, unless the Planning Secretary directs otherwise, the Proponent shall commission and pay the full cost of an Independent Environmental Audit of the project. This audit must:

(a) be conducted by a suitably qualified, experienced, and independent person(s) whose appointment has been approved by the Planning Secretary;

(b) include consultation with the relevant agencies;

(c) assess the environmental performance of the project, and its effects on the surrounding environment;

(*d*) assess whether the project is complying with the relevant standards, performance measures and statutory requirements; and

(e) review the adequacy of any strategy/plan/program required under this approval, and, if necessary, recommend measures or actions to improve the environmental performance of the project, and/or any strategy/plan/program required under this approval.

2.2 Audit Team

The Audit Team comprised Victoria Sedwick (Lead Auditor) and David Ford, Emily Rowe,

Camilla Firman and Fiona Robinson of Ramboll. The Audit Report was prepared by David Ford with input from other approved team members as required and reviewed and authorised by Victoria Sedwick.

2.3 Audit Objectives

The objective of the Audit was to independently assess the environmental performance and compliance status of the project during the Audit Period.

2.4 Audit Scope

The scope for the Audit is as follows:

- Consult with relevant agencies;
- Assess the environmental performance of the project, and its effects on the surrounding environment;
- Assess whether the project is complying with the relevant standards, performance measures and statutory requirements; and
- Review the adequacy of any strategy/plan/program required under this approval, and, if necessary, recommend measures or actions to improve the environmental performance of the project, and/or any strategy/plan/program required under the Project Approval.

2.5 Audit Period

The 2018 IEA site visit was conducted on 20 November 2018. The site visit for this IEA was conducted on 19 April 2022. The Audit Period for this IEA is from 21 November 2018 to 19 April 2022.

3. AUDIT METHODOLOGY

3.1 Selection and Endorsement of Audit Team

All of the Ramboll Auditors referred to in Section 2.2 have training and extensive experience in conducting environmental compliance audits and are independent from Multiquip Aggregates. Victoria Sedwick is a certified Lead Auditor with Exemplar Global (Certificate No. 13180). As required under the conditions of the Project Approval, endorsement of the Audit Team by the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE or the Department) was provided in a letter dated 21 December 2021 (**Appendix B**).

3.2 Independent Audit Scope Development

The scope for this Audit was developed to assess the development's environmental performance and compliance with the conditions of MP07_0155, which included all post approval documents prepared to satisfy the conditions. At the time of this audit, there had been three modifications of Project Approval.

3.3 Compliance Evaluation

The following forms of evidence were gathered during the conduct of the Audit:

- Site inspection of the Ardmore Park Quarry on 19 April 2022, which included the taking of photographs;
- Review of documents, reports and other records including approvals, reports prepared to satisfy the conditions, site inspection checklists, site photographs, site plans and drawings, as well as correspondence with agencies including WaterNSW; the NRAR; Goulburn Mulwaree Council; the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and DPE;
- Interviews of site personnel during the site inspection on 19 April 2022 with follow-up questions submitted by email (refer Section 3.4); and
- Review of documents posted on the internet including Multiquip Aggregates and DPE websites.

3.4 Site Inspection and Interviews

The Ardmore Park Quarry project was inspected by David Ford on 19 April 2022. The following personnel were present during the site visit and accompanied the Auditor during all or part of the site inspection or were interviewed during the site visit:

- Alexander Cox Multiquip Aggregates (Environmental Officer)
- Rhys Thompson 4Pillars (Senior Consultant)
- Stephen Wall Multiquip Aggregates (Quarry Operations Manager)

3.5 Consultation

4.2 Compliance Performance

The Auditors assessed the development to be compliant with MP07_0155 except for the noncompliances shown in Table 5. No non-compliances with the conditions of EPL 13213 were identified. Refer to the Independent Audit Table (**Appendix A**) for full details of the identified non-compliances and compliance status of other conditions. Section 5.1 provides recommendations associated with the non-compliances.

4.3 Summary of Agency Notices, Orders, Penalty Notices or Prosecutions

NRAR issued a penalty notice in March 2022 alleging a breach of the *Water Management Act 2000* by constructing and using a water supply work to dewater the old sand pit between March 2018 and January 2021 without holding a works approval. The works approval for WAL 41848 was issued in January 2021.

The Department issued a Notice to Furnish Information and Records dated 11 April 2022 in relation to the notified activity areas outside the approved area of disturbance. The deadline for provision of the information was 2 May 2022, which is outside the Audit Period.

The Department issued a Notice of Intent to Issue a Development Control Order in March 2022 in relation to non-compliances notified by Multiquip to the Department. Multiquip responded to this Notice. A Development Control Order was issued during the Audit Period.

4.4 Previous Audit Recommendations

The 2018 IEA identified four non-compliances with the Project Approval but did not make specific recommendations in relation to these non-compliances as they had been addressed and actioned accordingly. The 2018 IEA made one general recommendation and an assessment of progress on this recommendation is presented in Table 6.

4.5 EMP, Sub-plans and Post Approval Documents

Several management plans and the Environmental Management Strategy (EMS) date back to 2010 or 2011 and have not been progressively updated. Multiquip notified the Department in December 2021 that it had not complied with the condition requiring that strategies, plans, and programs be reviewed and, if revised, submitted to the Department for approval within 3 months of certain events (refer to NC12). Multiquip has since submitted updated versions of the Noise Monitoring Program, Air Quality Monitoring Program and Aboriginal Heritage Management Plan to the Department for review and has a plan in place to update the following documents:

- Environmental Management Strategy
- Water Management Plan

- Landscape Management Plan
- Environmental Management Program
- Waste Management Plan

As noted in sections 5.1 and 5.2 of this report, the Auditors recommend that:

- The revised management plans include:
 - A protocol for managing and reporting any incidents; complaints; non-compliances with statutory requirements; and exceedances of the impact assessment criteria and/or performance criteria; and
 - \circ $\,$ A protocol for periodic review of the plans.
- A process or procedure be put in place to ensure that strategies, plans, and programs are reviewed and, if revised, submitted to the Department for approval within 3 months of an event described in parts (a) (d) of Condition 5A of Schedule 5 of the Project Approval.

4.6 Environmental Management System

There is no project specific Environmental Management System for the project. The Auditors consider that the Environmental Management Strategy (EMS) and the various management plans noted in Section 4.5 will be generally appropriate for managing environmental matters once revision of these documents is completed.

4.7 Environmental Performance

Notwithstanding the identified non-compliances, environmental performance of the development during the Audit Period was considered to be of a generally adequate standard. Further opportunities for improvement have been identified as outlined in Section 4.13 with recommendations made in Section 5.2.

4.8 Complaints

Thirty five (35) complaints were received during the audit period with 17 having been received in 2019, 11 received in 2020, six received in 2021 and one received in 2022 up to the end of the Audit Period. Most complaints during the Audit Period related to noise (20 including two for trucks using engine braking). The number of noise complaints received has progressively reduced over the Audit Period.

Nine complaints during the Audit Period related to dust. The number of dust complaints received has progressively reduced over the Audit Period, with none received since September 2020.

Four complaints during the Audit Period related to quarry traffic and road safety (not including use of engine braking which is considered to be a noise issue).

There was a discrepancy between the number of complaints reported in Table 11 of the 2019/20 AEMR and the number of complaints recorded for that period in the Community Complaints Register. The reason for this discrepancy is not known; however, the two records matched in the 2021 AEMR.

4.9 Incidents

No environmental incidents have been reported during the Audit Period.

4.10 Actual Verses Predicted Environmental Impacts

Several activity areas that total 20.5 ha are outside the "approved area of disturbance". These activity areas are not in accordance with the project layout in the EA and appended to the Project Approval (as modified). Multiquip has notified the Department and provided a proposed plan to manage activities in those areas outside the approved area of disturbance. The Auditors have not identified significant adverse environmental impacts arising from these activities. However, there are environmental impacts as follows:

• Increased visual impact of stockpiles from outside the quarry site to the northeast (Inverary Road) and south.

• Not all topsoil was stripped from within the footprint stockpiles in the unauthorised disturbance areas and the quantity of that topsoil may be impacted.

4.11 Site Inspection

A site inspection was carried out by David Ford on 19 April 2022 accompanied by project personnel referred to in Section 3.4. Photographs taken during the site visit are provided in **Appendix D**.

4.12 Site interviews

Interviews on the day of the site visit and during subsequent virtual interviews involved the project personnel referred to in Section 3.4. Follow-up questions were submitted by email following the site inspection and interviews.

4.13 Improvement Opportunities

Opportunities for improvement have also been identified as shown in Table 7. Refer to Section 5.2 for recommended actions. Refer to the Independent Audit Tables (**Appendix A**) for full details.

4.14 Key Strengths

The Auditors consider management of the current stage of development to be of a generally adequate standard in relation to site management, environmental performance and documents/records management. Site personnel have a good understanding of environmental issues at the site. The Environmental Officer role is part time and is being supplemented by

personnel from the consultancy, 4Pillars. While this is seen as a strength, the Auditors note that 4Pillars personnel did not have full access to all records for the site during the Audit.

6. CONCLUSIONS

The Auditors assessed the development to be compliant with MP07_0155 except for fourteen non-compliances. No findings of non-compliance with the conditions of EPL 13213 have been made. Ten recommendations have been made in relation to the non-compliances with the Project Approval, as well as nine in relation to opportunities for improvement in relation to the Project Approval and/or EPL 13213.

The Auditors consider management of the project to be of a generally adequate standard in relation to site management and environmental performance. A number of management plans are out of date and are in the process of being revised.
